To the Prospective Sponsors of Research on the Carcinogenic Potential of Vinyl Chloride (Distribution list attached)

Dear Sirs:

Much more time has elapsed than anticipated when I wrote to you on May 26. Thank you for your patience. For the most part this has been due to awaiting a communication regarding liaison with the European research program, copy attached, with the remainder on account of my vacation absence.

In acknowledging the August 16th letter from ICI, I have expressed confidence you would find its terms acceptable, but subject to your unanimous concurrence. If no word from you to the contrary reaches me by September 20, I will construe this to denote your acceptance, and proceed with a formal agreement accordingly.

Financial commitments to the program proposed for MCA administration are nearly sufficient, with strong interest in some cases for taking full advantage of information from the European program before final confirmation of support.

PROPOSED MCA RESEARCH PROGRAMME ON THE CARCINOGENIC POTENTIAL OF VINYL CHLORIDE

Dear Mr Best

As you probably know, there has recently been a meeting of the European companies who are already sponsoring a programme of experimental work aimed at investigating the possible carcinogenic properties of vinyl chloride monomer. The work in Europe has now been under way for about twelve months and preliminary results are beginning to become available.

The meeting discussed the relationship of the European programme to the work about to be started by MCA. It was agreed by the participating companies that benefits to both sides could be achieved if there was co-ordination between the programmes so as to make the results mutually supportive as far as possible. At the same time, the opportunity to be able to control the disclosure of information arising from the European toxicological studies was emphasised.

Against this background the European Group agreed in principle to collaborate with the MCA and disclose the experimental protocol and, at an appropriate time, the results on the following conditions:

- a) That the companies sponsoring the European work should be represented in both the MCA VCM Research Sponsorship Group and in the project's Technical Co-ordinating Task Group.
- b) No disclosure of information arising from the European investigation should be made outside the individuals comprising the Technical Co-ordinating Task Group without the specific consent of the European Group. At the same time, the members of the European Group would accept the restriction on communication of the MCA results as originally expressed in the draft research programme dated 27th January 1972.
- c) No financial contribution will be required from members of the European Group who shall have equal status to other contributing sponsors.
